**Galveston County requires all Recreational Vehicles in San Leon to be permitted**

*Per Article 5 section B # 7 in the Regulations of the Galveston county Floodplain Management*

**Recreational Vehicles** – *Require that recreational vehicles placed on sites within Zones A1-30 AH and AW on the community's Firm (1) be on the site for fewer than 180 consecutive days, (2) be fully licensed and ready for highway use with no special or additional permits needed for transport over highways, or (3) meet the requirements for Article 4, Section B (5) and elevation anchoring requirements for "manufactured homes" in paragraph (4) of this section. A recreational vehicle is ready for highway use if it is on its wheel or jacking system is attached to the site only by quick disconnects type utilities and security devices, and has no permanently attached additions.*

*A new permit must be obtained for an additional 180 days by complying with the following regulations:*


- 1. Completely remove the vehicle or trailer from the lot prior to the expiration date of the existing permit.*
- 2. Apply for a new permit*
- 3. Call for an inspection of the empty lot*
- 4. Call for another inspection after the vehicle is replaced in the lot*
- 5. if the above conditions are not complied with, the original permit will expire and the vehicle or trailer will have to be moved and will not be permitted again*

**San Leon Municipal Utility District permit requirements**

The San Leon Municipal Utilities District requires all recreational vehicles connected to the District Water and Wastewater System to have a valid Recreational Vehicle permit that can be obtained from Galveston County Engineer's office.

Currently there is a recreational vehicle connected to the District's system without a valid permit on your property. In order for the District to maintain services to your residence a valid recreational vehicle permit must be obtained. If it is an extra unit that is attached to the system you must apply for separate taps with a valid permit. Please provide the proper documents within **30** days of this letter to the District Office so that the District may continue service to your property.
